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Idea & Information

The Swiss Wavepool Championship is the Swiss Surfing Competition in “stationary wave riding”. The competition will be held 2017 on the The Wave Factory/Citywave and includes a men, women, junior (<18) and expression category.

Eligibility

Eligible to participate on the Swiss Wavepool Championship are all men, women and juniors who have a valid Swiss passport. All riders without a valid Swiss Passport are invited to compete in the expression category. Underage persons have to submit a letter of agreement signed by their parents in advance. The use of the Citywave occurs at your own risk - parents are responsible for their children!

Registration

All participants are obliged to register for the contest.

Registration has to occur via <http://waveriding.ch/swiss-wavepool-championship/> latest till Friday, September 1st.

Entry Fee

The entry Fee is **CHF 90.-** for participating the championship. This includes a automatically a one year subcriptions for the Swiss Surfing Assoziation. For all riders which are already active members of the Swiss Surfing assoziation the entry fee is CHF 40.- .

By registering, you commit to participating in the contest. Fake registrations (e.g. for getting more surfing time without competing at the contest) result in you getting blocked for the participation of the following events.

Equipment

It is recommended to bring your own equipment for the competition. Nevertheless the standard softboards and wetsuits of „The wave factory“ could be used.

Trainings

There are three training slots scheduled. Between the heats, only riders from the next heat are allowed to surf. The detailed training procedure/schedule for each rider will be communicated through our social media channels.

Categories

There are three different categories for the first Swiss Wavepool Championship. Men and women category for all riders who are 18 or older and a junior category for all riders younger than 18.

Beside the Swiss Wavepool Championship there will be an expression category for all riders without a Swiss passport.

Riders are only allowed to compete in one of those categories.

Competiton format

The competition format is a double elimination for each category. Every Rider has at least two heats to compete.

Setting: Best 8 Riders men (Landlocked Ranking) are spread over the 8x Round 1 Heats and best 4 Riders women (Landlocked Ranking) are spread over the 4x Round 1 Heats.

Heat time: Each heat lasts 6-10 minutes for the 3-6 riders. The best two riders of every heat will qualify for the next round.

Number of Participants

Men: 32 Riders; Women: 16 Riders; Junior: 8 Riders; Expression: 8 Riders

A minimum of four riders is required for each category. If one category have less then four registrations, the affected rider(s) could compete in one of the remaining competitions.

In case the maximum of riders exceed above number of participants the heats will be filled up to a max. of 6 Riders per heat.

Judging

Four Judges including one Head Judge are responsible for the competition judging. Each ridden wave will be judged however only the two best waves will be counted.

Judging criteria:

Bad Waves: 0.1 - 1.9 / Poor Waves: 2.0 - 3.9 / Average Waves: 4.0 - 5.9 / Good Waves: 6.0 - 7.9 / Excellent: 8.0 – 10

The judging of the Swiss Wavepool Championship is carried out with variations as follows: Judges will utilize a 60-40% ratio being that surfers will only ever get a maximum of 60% (6.0 points) of the scale for surfing, up to an additional 40% (4.0 points) for tricks when the two aspects are combined.

Judges & Contest Organization

The Swiss Wavepool Championship is organized by the Swiss Surfing Association (SSA).

Judges: Will be announced during the contest. The nominated judges are required to have judging experience adequate to the level of surfing of the SWC.

The complete competition will be held on The Wave Factory , Citywave on the Geroldareal in Zurich.

Competition Rules

General Rules

- Surfing with leash is mandatory
- Surfing between the heats is only allowed for the surfers of the upcoming heat to warm up
- All necessary information will be printed on the blackboard at the event module
- Schedule is always subject to change. We do not recommend to leave the contest area during the competition.
- The competition lycra has to be worn during the heats, interviews and the award ceremony. It needs to be returned immediately after your heat.
- All information and changes during the competition will be communicated at the blackboard on the eventmodule or by our speaker. We do not take any responsibility for missed information during the competition.

Heat Rules

- Up to 6 surfers ride in one heat
- Heat duration will be 8 -10 minutes (4-6 surfers) and 6 minutes (3 surfers)
- Heat starts with one honk
- Heat ends with one honk
- Heat gets interrupted by two honks
- Every wave has a max. duration of 30 sec.
- 1 time whistling means 5 sec until end of wave (last trick)
- 2 times whistling means end of wave - please leave the pool directly
- All seedings are announced on the black board.
- Every surfer is responsible for getting to their heats in time. Missing a heat leads to disqualification.
- Surfers start in order the headjudge or speaker will announce before every heat and will follow this order during the whole heat.

Interference

Interference penalties are called by the judges and must have a majority vote to be declared an actual penalty

Reasons can be:

- Not following the priority rule (“snaking”)
- Surfing between heats if the surfer is not surfing in the upcoming heat
- Breach of rules, or generally unfair behaviour
- Multiple interferences can lead to a disqualification.

Prizes & Award Ceremony

There will be cash and goody prizes. Below cash prizes are for each category.

1st Place: 200.- CHF.

2nd Place: 100.- CHF.

3rd Place: 50.- CHF

The attendance of the award ceremony is mandatory for the for surfers placed 1 to 4. During the ceremony and interviews it is mandatory to wear the contest-lycra.

Landlocked Surfteam

All Riders have the chance to win points for the ranking of the landlocked surfers. **Best 3 Men, 2 Women and 1 Junior of this ranking qualify themselves for the Swiss Landlocked Surf Team**, which is the official represent of the best Swiss Landlocked surfers. Additionally the team will be extended with two wildcards for special events and show sessions.

The ranking is based on the results of the official SSA competitions of the last three years as well as an overall landlocked surf performance evaluation (as there is only one competition per year at the moment). Points are given as follows:
